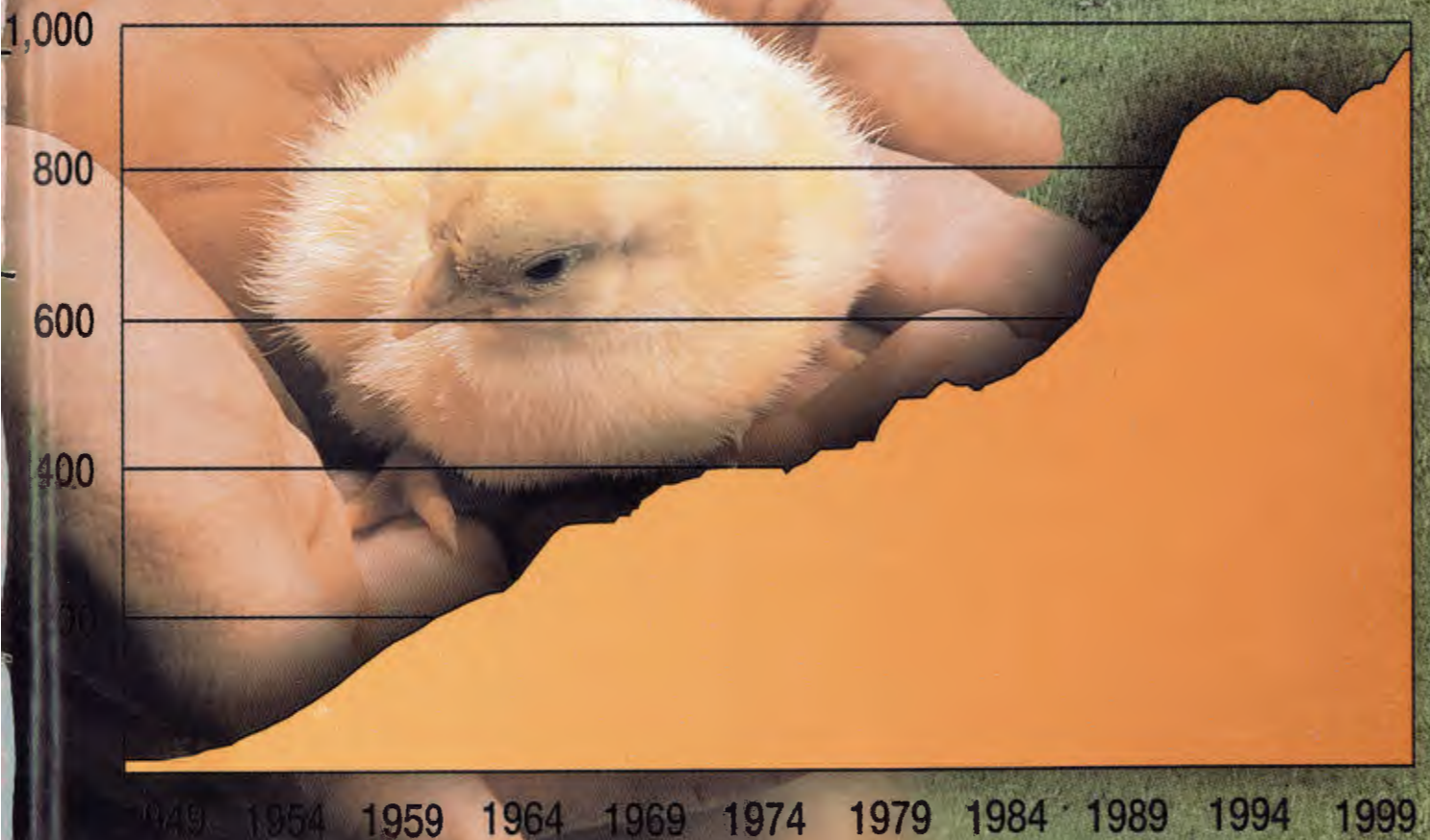

# Chicken & Egg Recipes

## Homestyle Good Morning Casserole

- 4 bread slices, crust trimmed
- 6 eggs
- 1½ cups skim milk
- 4 slices cooked turkey bacon, crumbled
- ¼ cup shredded low-fat Swiss cheese, divided
- ¼ cup shredded low-fat Cheddar cheese, divided
- ⅓ cup sliced mushrooms
- ¼ teaspoon seasoned salt
- ½ cup frozen O'Brien style hashbrown potatoes

Place bread slices, slightly overlapping, in bottom of lightly greased 9x9-inch baking dish. In large bowl, thoroughly combine eggs, milk, bacon, 2 tablespoons Cheddar cheese, mushrooms and salt. Pour mixture over bread slices. Sprinkle potatoes over egg mixture and top with remaining Swiss and Cheddar cheese. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Bake at 350 degrees Fahrenheit, uncovered, until lightly browned and knife inserted near center comes out clean, about 40 to 45 minutes.

*(6 servings)*

## Mocha Chocolate Cheesecake

- 2 tablespoons graham cracker crumbs
- 2-3 tablespoons instant espresso powder
- 1 tablespoon hot water
- 3 8-ounce packages Neufchatel cheese, softened
- ¾ cup sugar
- 6 eggs
- ¼ cup mini chocolate chips, or more if needed

Coat bottom of a 9-inch springform pan with cooking spray. Dust with cracker crumbs. Combine espresso powder with water; mix well. In a large bowl combine cheese, sugar, and espresso mixture; beat until smooth. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir in chocolate chips. Pour batter into prepared pan. Place pan in a large baking dish. Fill baking dish with hot water to a depth of 1 inch. Bake at 350 degrees Fahrenheit, for 1 hour. Remove cheesecake from water bath and let cool on wire rack. Cover and chill thoroughly before service. If desired, sprinkle additional chocolate chips on top before serving.

## Smokey Chicken Breast Fillets and Apples

- 6 skinless, boneless chicken breast fillets
- 1½ teaspoons liquid smoke, divided
- ½ teaspoon poultry seasoning
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon mace
- ¼ teaspoon nutmeg
- ¼ teaspoon dry mustard
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 3 tablespoons clarified butter
- 3 cooking apples, peeled, sliced

Rub each chicken breast fillet with ¼ teaspoon liquid smoke. In small bowl, mix together poultry seasoning, salt, mace, nutmeg, dry mustard and pepper; sprinkle on both sides of chicken and let sit about 5 minutes.\* In 10-inch nonstick frypan over medium temperature, pour clarified butter and heat about 2 minutes. Add seasoned chicken fillets and cook about 5 minutes more. Rearrange so that chicken is on top of apples; cook about 4 minutes more or until chicken and apples are tender. *(6 servings)*

*\*Chicken may be seasoned and refrigerated for later cooking, if desired.*

## Broiled Chicken Deluxe

- 1 broiler-fryer chicken, halved
- ½ lemon
- ¼ pound butter, melted
- 2 teaspoons salt
- ¼ teaspoon black pepper
- ½ teaspoon paprika
- 2 teaspoons sugar

Rub entire surface of chicken with lemon, continually squeezing out some juice. Place chicken in broiler pan with rack, skin side up. Pour butter on chicken and sprinkle with salt, pepper, paprika and sugar. Place under broiler as far from heat as possible for 10 minutes to allow seasonings to penetrate chicken. Move pan up so top surface of chicken is 4 inches from heat and continue broiling. Baste occasionally with melted butter and turn each piece to ensure even browning for about 35 minutes or until done. *(2 servings)*

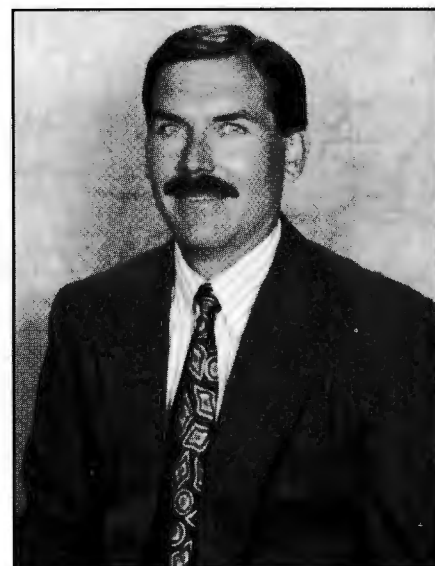
With help from the Governor's Office, the Emergency Management Agency, the Department of Transportation, the Alabama National Guard, the Alabama's Farmer's Federation, the Alabama Cattlemen's Association, the Alabama Cooperative Extension System and countless volunteers, this department took the lead this summer in securing and delivering 8.3 million pounds of hay to cattle farmers in 24 counties who were in desperate need of feed supplies due to the drought. ## State Highlights for 1999-2000:

- ✗ Total farm and forestry receipts were over \$4.87 billion for the year.
- ✗ Cash receipts from farm commodities totaled \$3.44 billion, against \$3.30 billion the previous year.
- ✗ The top five farm commodities for cash receipts were: (1) poultry, (2) cattle and calves, (3) greenhouse, sod and nursery products, (4) cotton and (5) peanuts. Together they made up 90 percent of the total commodity receipts. Sales from these enterprises were each over \$100 million.
- ✗ Livestock and poultry accounted for four-fifths (81%) of the cash receipts and crops the other fifth (19%).
- ✗ Poultry made up 63 percent of the total cash receipts.
- ✗ Alabama ranked third in broiler production with marketings of 971.2 million birds.
- ✗ Laying flocks produced 2.45 billion eggs to rank 13th in egg production.
- ✗ Cattle inventory on January 1, 2000 was 1.46 million head. The state's ranking was 24th.
- ✗ Catfish sales amounted to \$71.1 million. Alabama ranked second behind Mississippi in sales.
- ✗ Principal crops and acreages were: cotton (565,000), soybeans (240,000), corn (220,000), peanuts (207,000), and wheat (140,000).
- ✗ The state ranked third in peanuts and 9th in cotton production.
- ✗ Honey production amounted to 1,156,000 pounds taken from 17,000 bee colonies.
- ✗ Alabama ranked second in commercial forest land, with 21.9 million acres.

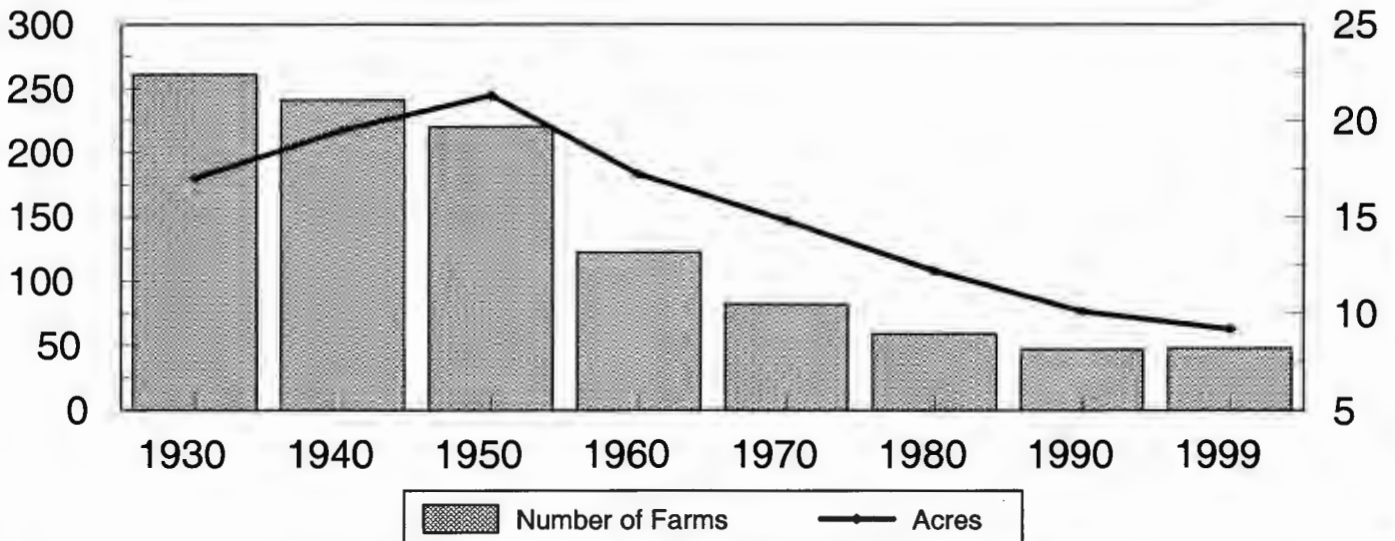

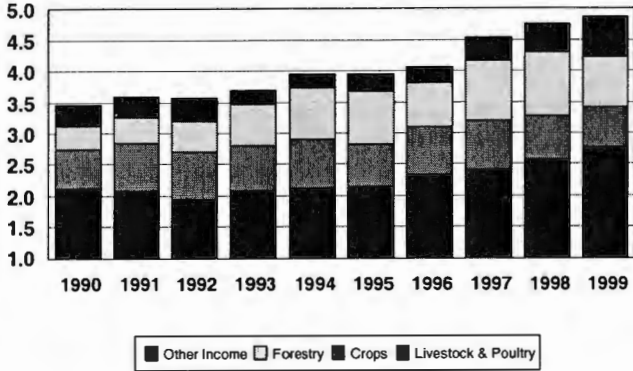

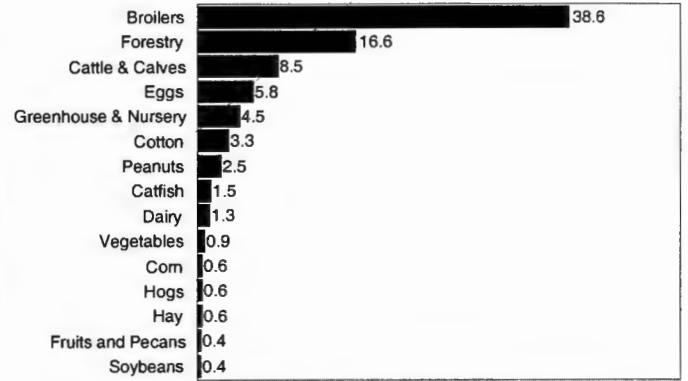

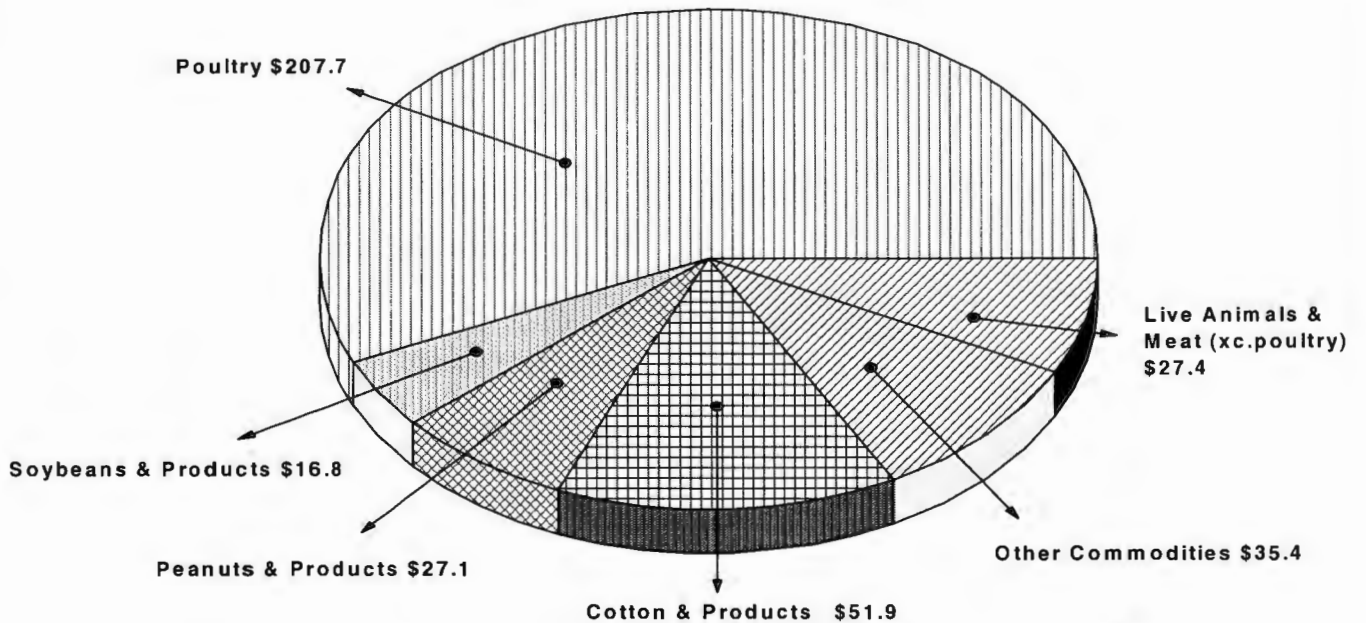


### Total Farm & Forestry Receipts - 1999 Percents By Commodity



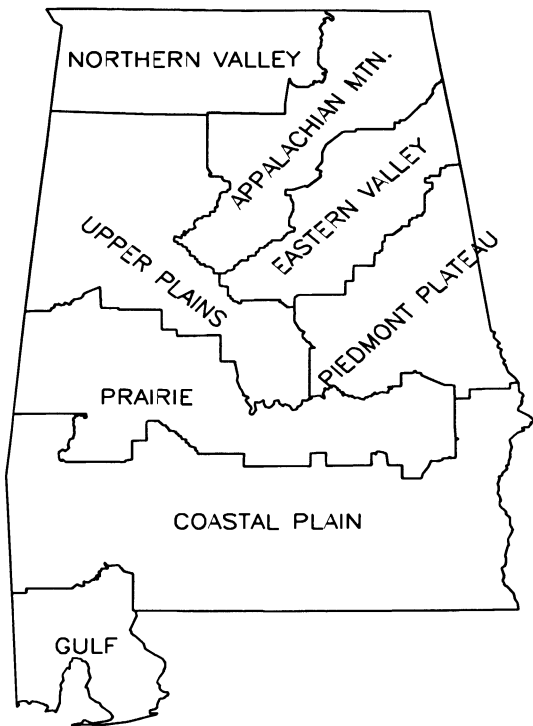
These 15 commodities accounted for 86% of Total Farm & Forestry Receipts

The best way to describe the 1999 crop year is to divide it into two halves. The season got off to a good start with ample amounts of precipitation. Planting progress lagged slightly behind the 5-year average. By mid-summer, however, precipitation grew scarce over most of the state and soil moisture supplies declined. Hot, dry conditions hastened maturity of cotton and soybeans and harvest progressed ahead of the 5 year average. Nothing illustrates the split more than the exceptional corn crop. Corn growers harvested a record 103 bushels, compared with 63 bushels in 1998 and the previous record of 96 bushels in 1994. The wheat yield of 48 bushels tied the record set in 1994. These record crops were established before adverse conditions hit. Oat yield was set at 44 bushels per acre. Unfavorable conditions of the latter half of the season are reflected in the cotton yield of 549 pounds and the soybean yield of 16 bushels. Yields for the 1998 crop were 559 pounds and 22 bushels respectively. Cotton and soybean acreage in North Alabama was hardest hit, with some farmers cutting their beans for hay. Ron Weeks, Extension Entomologist at the Wiregrass Research and Extension Center, said "Summer rains in June and July provided good crop development and the potential for peanuts and cotton looked good up to that point. The lack of rainfall and extreme heat stress through August and September however, were devastating to the Wiregrass crops in general. The lack of late August and early September rains was especially hard on the peanut crop." Peanut growers managed a yield of 2,175 pounds, 105 pounds higher than the previous year's drought affected crop. Pecan growers experienced a relatively uneventful year after enduring hurricanes that affected the previous two seasons. Growers harvested 13.0 million pounds total production. This "on year" production was 8.0 million pounds more than the "off year" production of 5.0 million pounds a year earlier, and equal to the 1997 crop. Peach growers also had a good year. According to Bobby Boozer, Auburn University Area Horticulturist, "It appears from hind sight that some of the chill hours after February 15<sup>th</sup> were beneficial to the peach trees and helped set fruit on the trees. What did occur was a long extended bloom period, extremely slow leafing and new shoot development, but fruit were present and often for an extended period of time before the leaf canopy developed. As a result, many growers experienced severe sizing problems and harvest shortages or gluts during certain periods of the growing season." Dry land vegetable farmers experienced a poor production year with extreme heat and dry weather exacting a toll in the absence of irrigation.

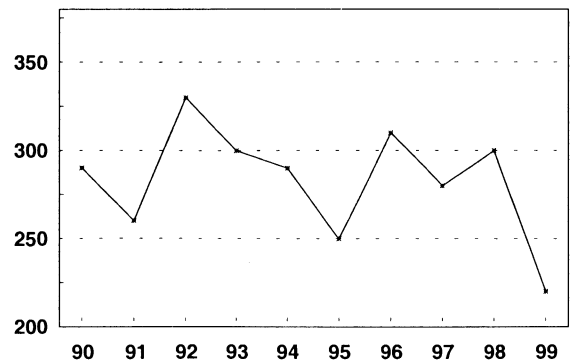

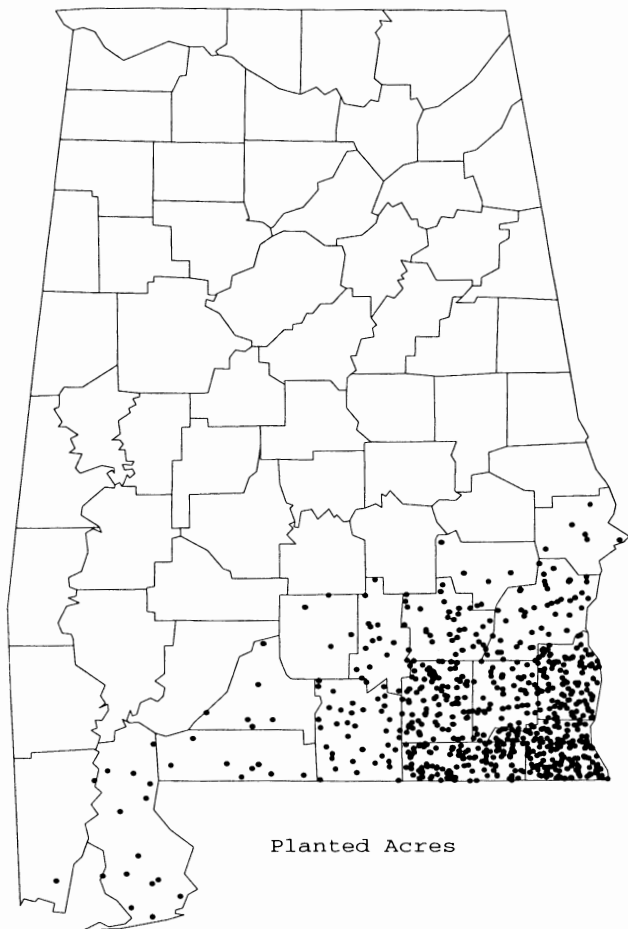

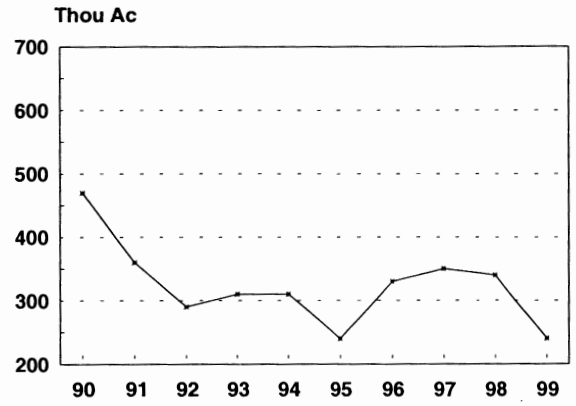

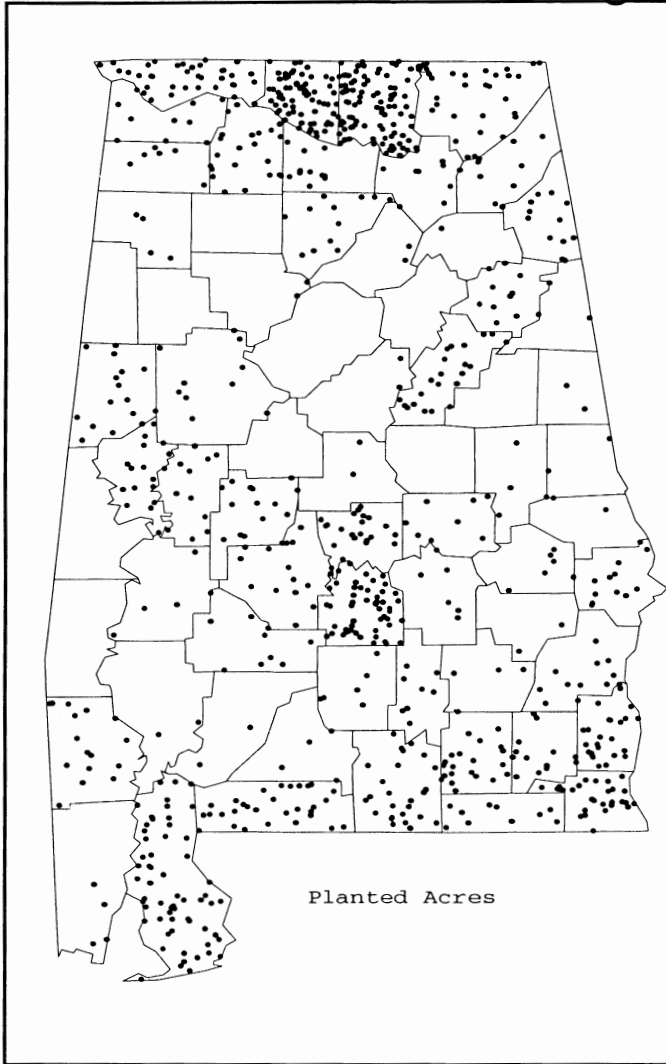

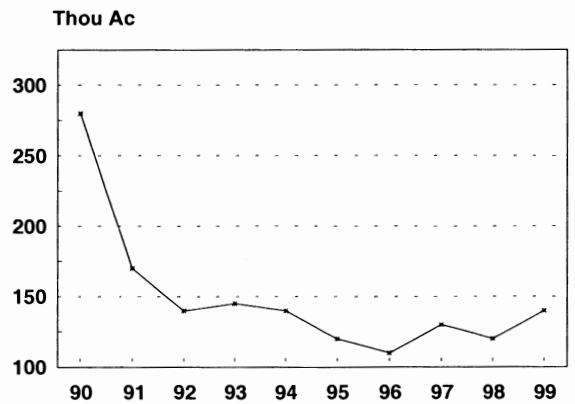

**Cattle and Calves:** Cash receipts from farm marketings increased 10 percent from 1998 to \$414.5 million. There was a 2 percent increase in the number of cattle and calves marketed. Prices received by Alabama producers during 1999 increased to \$60.10 per hundredweight for cattle and 84.70 for calves. On January 1, 2000, 1.46 million head of cattle and calves were on farms in Alabama, a decrease of 3 percent from a year earlier. Beef cow inventory remained unchanged at 793,000 head and beef cow replacement heifers, at 95,000 head, were down 14 percent from the previous year. There were 27,000 milk cows in Alabama dairy herds, the same as in 1998.

**Hogs and Pigs:** All hogs and pigs on hand December 1, 1999 numbered 175,000 head. The number of breeding hogs held steady at 15,000 and total market hogs, at 160,000, were down 9 percent. The 33,000 sows farrowed 267,000 pigs in 1999. The average number of pigs per litter was 8.09, compared with 8.06 in 1998. Cash receipts from hogs and pigs were \$30.0 million and the average price received per cwt was \$29.70.

**Milk Production:** The number of operations with milk cows during 1999 was estimated at 340. This number includes any operation with one or more milk cows. There were 158 commercial dairies as of January 1, 2000 according to the State Department of Agriculture and Industries. Milk produced in the State totaled 374 million pounds in 1999, 3 percent less than the previous year. Milk per cow increased 66 pounds to average 13,852 pounds. Prices received for milk remained at \$16.50 in 1999. Alabama cash receipts from milk decreased 3 percent in 1999 to 61.2 million.

**Catfish:** Sales of catfish in Alabama increased 16 percent to \$71.1 million during 1999 from \$61.5 million during 1998. There were 255 operations in the State producing catfish on January 1, 2000. Water surface area was up 800 acres from last year, totaling 22,100 acres.

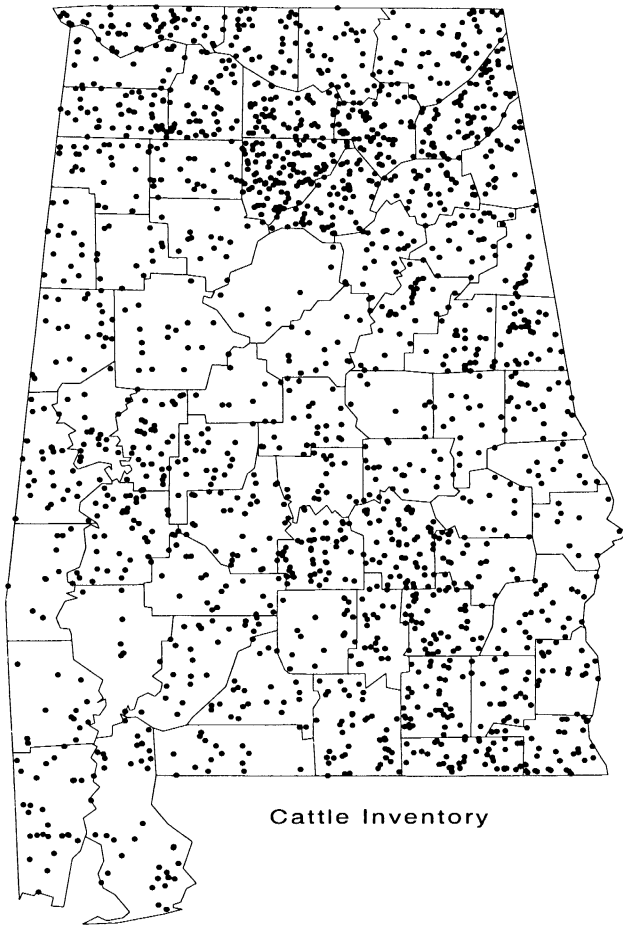
**Honey:** Honey production in 1999 totaled 1.2 million pounds, up 2 percent from 1998. There were 17,000 colonies producing honey in 1999 up 6 percent from the previous year. Yield per colony averaged 68 pounds, down 3 pounds from a year ago. The average price per pound was 56 cents, dropping 16 cents from 1998.

Cash receipts for Alabama's livestock and poultry production steadily climbed during the decade of the 1990's from \$2.13 billion in 1990 to a record high \$2.78 billion for 1999. Broiler receipts accounted for most of the increase. Receipts for cattle and calves started at \$554.8 million then dropped sharply to a low of \$286.1 million in 1996. They rebounded to finish the period at \$414.5 million. Catfish producers more than doubled their receipts during the 1990's, going from \$31.0 million in 1990 to \$71.1 million in 1999.

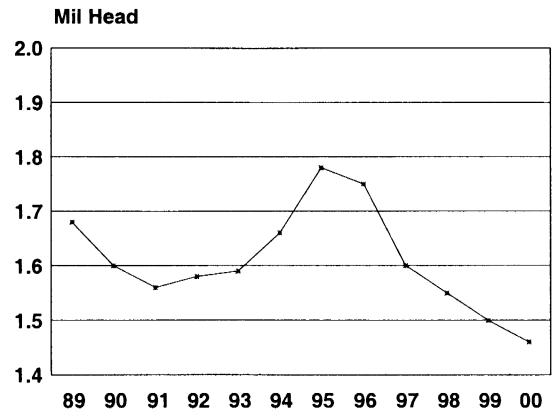
# Cattle and Calves, 2000

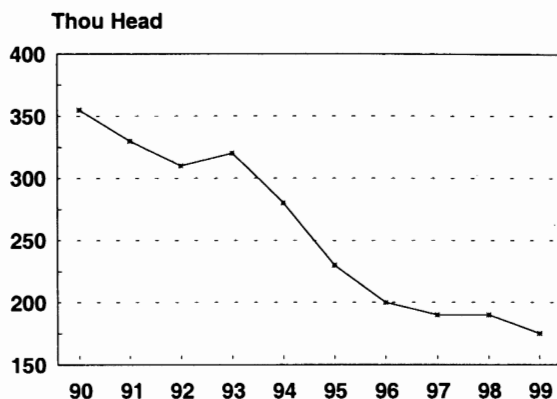

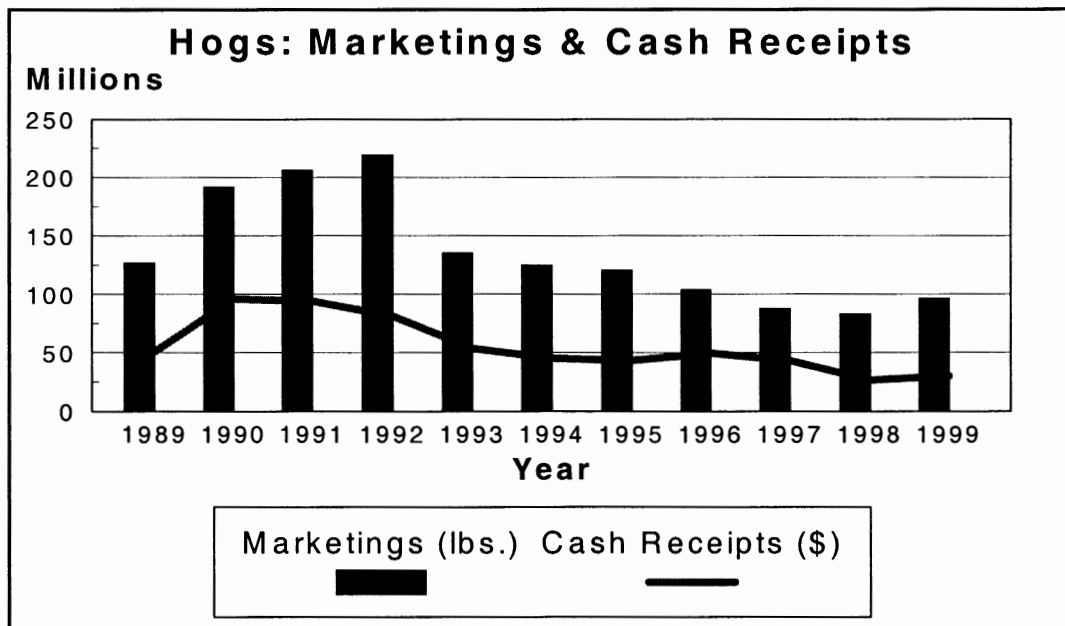

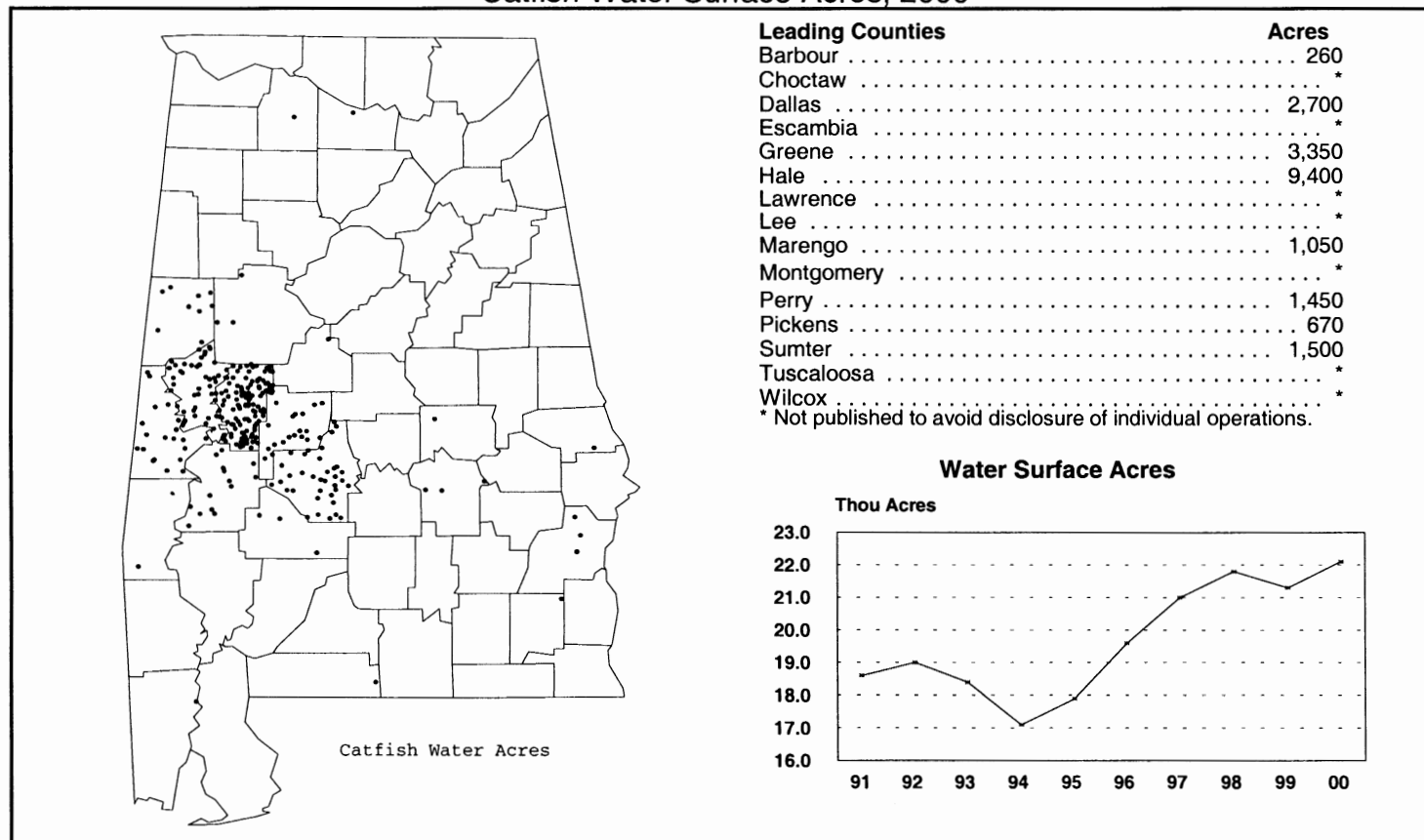

**Broiler Production and Value:** Alabama broiler producers marketed 971.2 million birds during the 1999 marketing year, an increase of 5 percent from 1998. Cullman was the leading broiler county, followed by DeKalb, Marshall, Blount, and Coffee. Cash receipts amounted to \$1.88 billion, up 4 percent from the previous year. Alabama ranked third in broiler production behind Georgia and Arkansas.

**Layer and Eggs:** During 1999, Alabama's laying flocks produced 2.45 billion eggs, down 2 percent from the previous year. There were 10.5 million layers 20 weeks old and older on hand December 1, 1999 compared with 10.6 million in 1998. Cullman County had the largest inventory, followed by DeKalb, Marshall, Blount, and Baldwin counties. Cash receipts from eggs were \$281.8 million, up 31 percent from 1998. Alabama ranked 13th nationally in egg production.

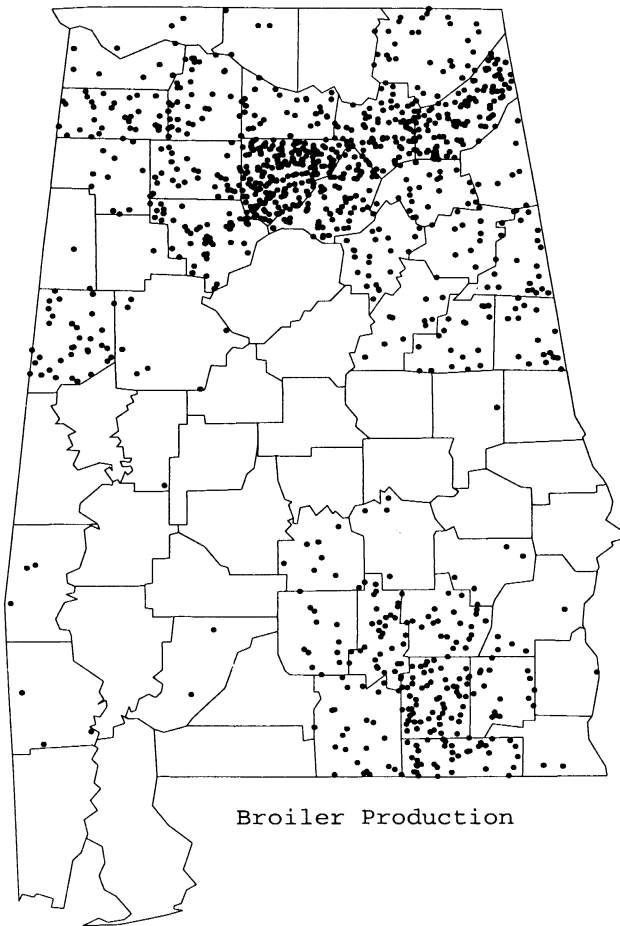
**Broiler Hatchery Production:** Commercial broiler hatcheries in Alabama hatched 1.14 billion chicks in 1999, up 4 percent from the previous year. Alabama hatcheries shipped 142.2 million broiler-type chicks to other states, including 50.6 million to Mississippi and 54.2 million to Georgia. Chicks shipped into Alabama numbered 35.7 million. Egg-type hatchery data are not published to avoid disclosing individual operations.

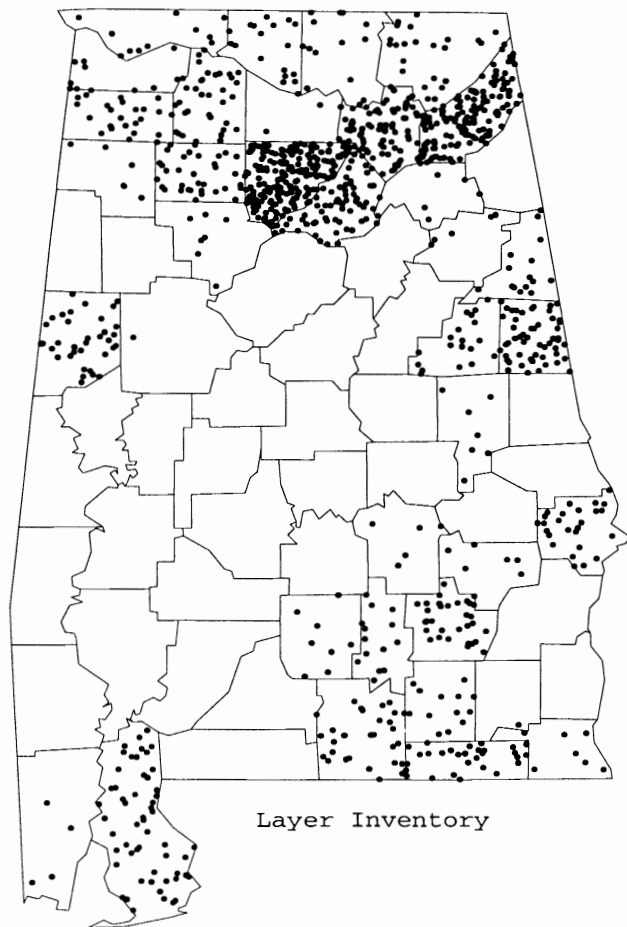

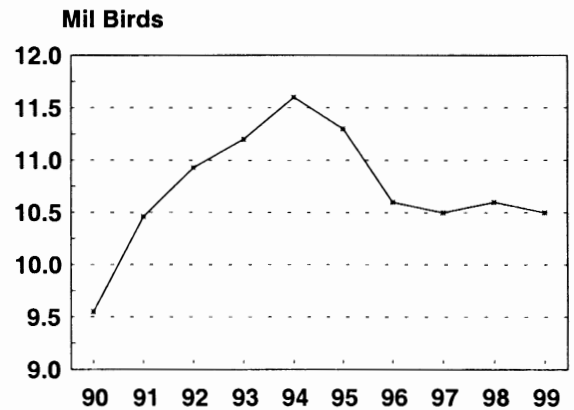

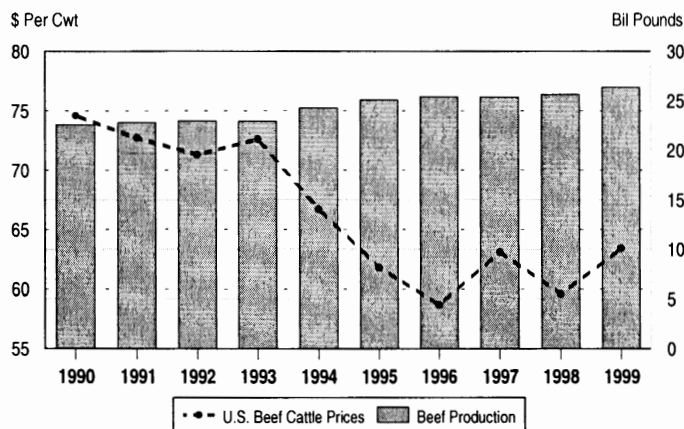

Beef production is expected to decline 4-5 percent in 2001 following a record 26.8 billion pounds in 2000. Producers will be looking to retain heifers for the breeding herd rather than placing them in feed lots. Also, due to the declining cattle inventory, steer and cow slaughter should continue to decline.

Cattle prices, in the face of large supplies of competing meats at relatively low prices, have rebounded from the lows reached in the mid-1990's. The robust U.S. economy underlies the current strength in meat demand, which has shored up prices despite large supplies. With expectations of higher prices, especially for cattle that will grade Choice, increased heifer retention for breeding following 2000's calf crop is expected in 2001 provided adequate forage is available.

**Farm Cash Receipts:** Farm receipts for 1999 again set a record high in Alabama totaling \$4.23 billion, 7 percent above 1998 farm receipts. This includes receipts for crops, livestock and poultry, government payments, farm forest products, and other farm related income such as custom work. Total farm and forestry receipts, including non-farm commercial timber, reached a record high \$4.87 billion.

Broiler receipts, the largest individual commodity in Alabama's total receipts, reached a record \$1.88 billion, up 4 percent from the previous year. Cattle receipts were up 10 percent totaling \$414.5 million as cattle prices continued to increase. Egg receipts totaled \$281.8 million in 1999, up 31 percent from the previous year. Catfish sales totaled a record \$71.1 million while receipts for hogs increased 12 percent to \$30.0 million. Total livestock and poultry receipts, at \$2.78 billion, were 7 percent above 1998 receipts.

Alabama cotton receipts in 1999 totaled \$163.0 million, a 17 percent drop from 1998. Greenhouse, sod, and nursery sales totaled \$220.6 million, up 5 percent from the previous year. Peanut returns were down 6 percent to \$120.1 million. Corn receipts increased 4 percent, while soybean receipts fell by 53 percent. Total crop receipts were \$661.6 million, down 7 percent from 1998.

**Cash Receipts by County:** For counties with limited production of a specific commodity, cash receipts for that commodity are not published, but are included in the county's Total Farm Receipts.

**Definitions:** The definitions below will be helpful in interpreting the information on the following pages.

**Cash Receipts:** Sales of agricultural commodities at the first point of sale by establishments (farms) from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were or would normally be sold during the year. Cash receipts include sales of commodities regardless of year produced. They exclude non-monetary transactions such as on-farm use of agricultural commodities.

**Government Payments:** Includes cash payments for feed grains, wheat, and cotton, amounts paid under agricultural and conservation programs, and miscellaneous payments under programs such as Rural Clean Water and Disaster. The Farm Service Agency (FSA) supplied the information.

**Farm Forest Products:** Stumpage revenue from sales of forest products from farms. These data and non-farm timber sales by county were provided by the Alabama Forestry Commission.

**Non-farm Commercial Timber:** Stumpage revenue from sales of forest products taken from other private, (non-farm) forest industry and government owned lands.

**Other Farm Income:** Includes machine hire and custom work, custom feeding fees, and other farm business-related income. In the county tables, these receipts are not published separately but are included in each county's Total Farm Receipts. .

**Value of Production:** Crop value is derived by multiplying production by the season average price received by farmers. Value of production for livestock and poultry reflects inventory value. It is derived by multiplying the number of head by the average value per head. Value of production is shown in other sections of the bulletin.

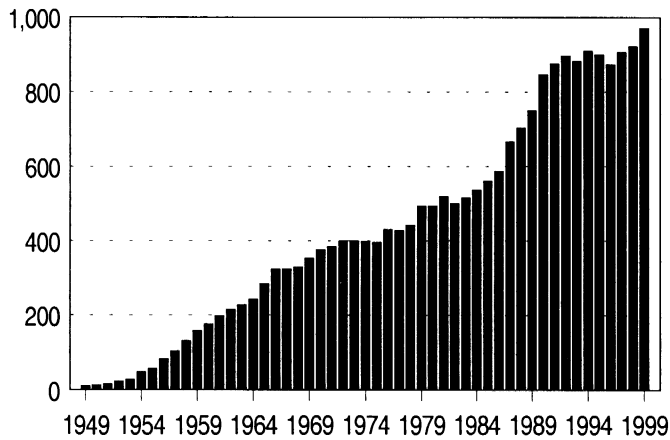

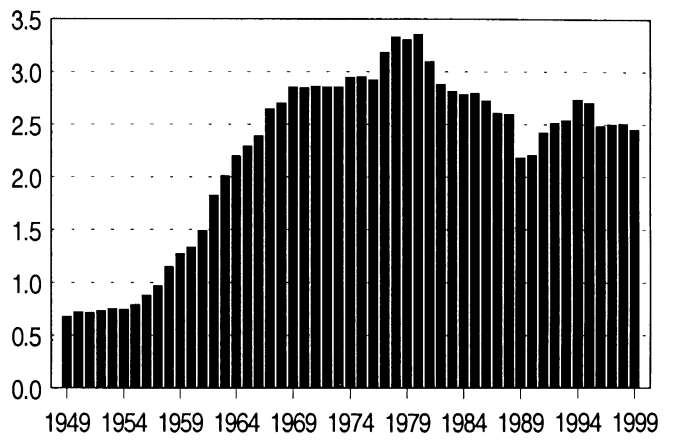

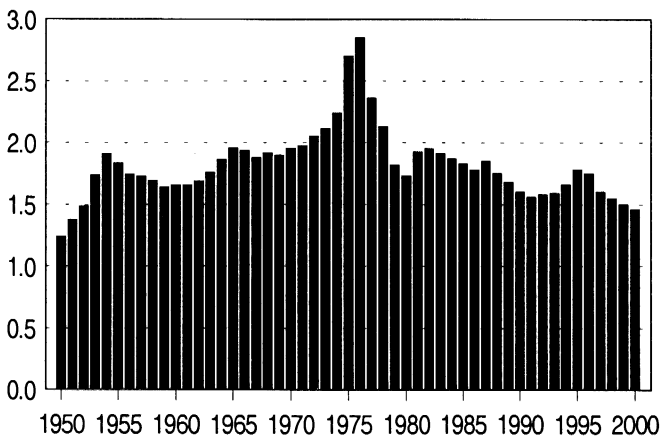

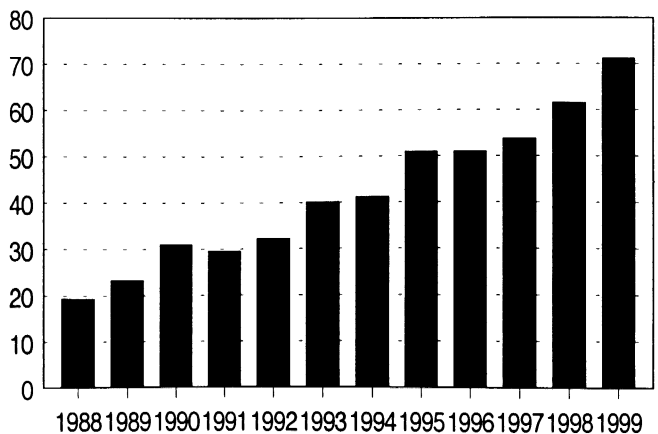

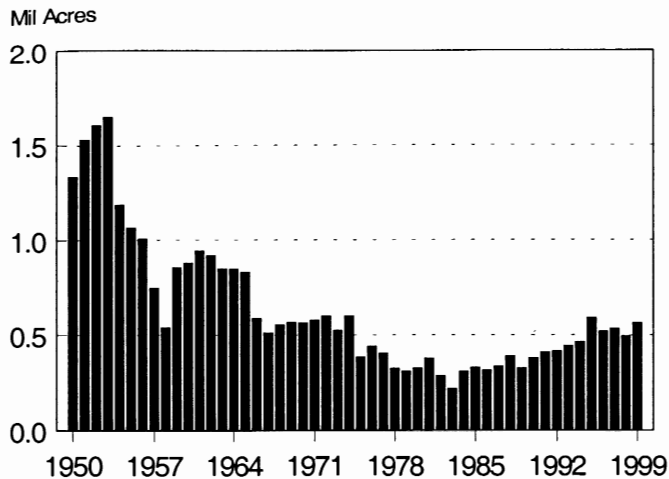

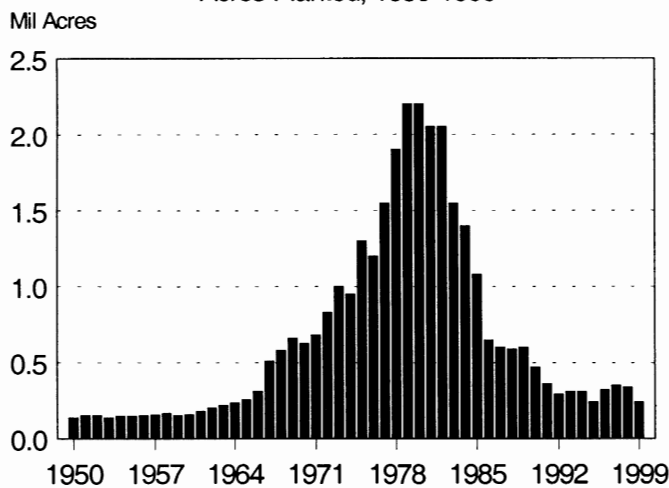

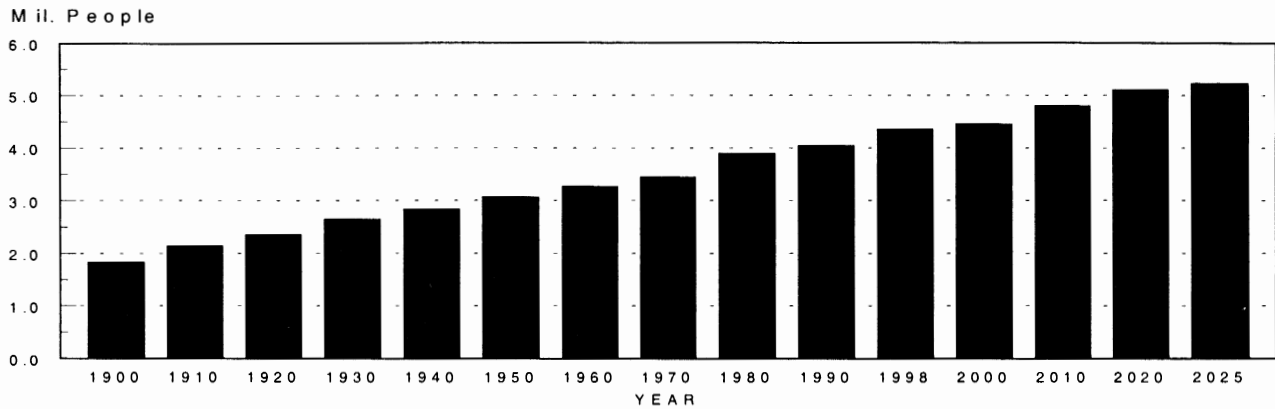
